Travel

Air: There are regular flights to Coolangatta (Gold Coast airport) and Brisbane from most regional and city airports. Just 10 minutes from the venue – check website for airport transfers.

Road: The major route from Sydney to Coolangatta is via the Pacific Highway (875 km).

This road has been undergoing major upgrades. Likewise the main route from Brisbane to Coolangatta (100 km) has been undergoing major upgrades and conditions vary.

Rail: Due to a difference in the gauge of the railway between New South Wales and Queensland there are no interstate direct rail links to Coolangatta. Trains depart daily from Sydney and terminate at Murwillumbah (around 30 mins south of Coolangatta).
